To be admitted into the concentration, a student must:

- ✓ Submit a Declaration Form to the Associate Dean for Academic Affairs no later than the final day of class of the student's penultimate semester.
- ✓ Be certified by the Associate Dean as having met the requirements for admission to the concentration.

To receive this certificate, a student must:

- ✓ Have a cumulative GPA in all courses of 2.75 or above upon graduation.
- Complete a total of at least 14 credit hours in the courses listed below. At least 9 hours must be under grading option A.
- ✓ Earn a minimum of a 3.0 grade point average in the courses taken to satisfy the concentration.
- ✓ Complete and submit this form to the Registrar for verification four weeks prior to graduation.
