Important:

- Legacy Houses:
 - Special Interest House Advisers listed on the Legacy House <u>list</u> will be sent a <u>Housing Application Code</u>. This code should be given to the group leader. The code will give the group access to complete the Special Interest House Application.
 - PATH Credit:
 - Groups currently living in SIH Legacy houses must have an average of 8 PATH credit/person.
 - Groups planning to live in the house for 2022-2023 must have an average of 8 PATH credit/person.
- There is <u>no revision</u> period for applications. Once you submit your application it will either be approved or denied. Groups should share their application with their Adviser.
- General interest groups will be assigned based on their PATH credit and the preferences identified in their application.

If the group is approved, the group will be assigned to a property based on their PATH credit.
January 28, 2022	All applications must be completed and submitted online by 4:30 pm.
February 24, 2022	Groups will be informed of their Special Interest Housing assignment.
March 1, 2022	Groups must accept or decline their housing assignment.

GROUP NAME:

SPECIAL INTEREST GROUP INTENT & PURPOSE:

SMART Goal:

Each Special Interest House will <u>develop one SMART goal</u>. The SMART goal will connect the group's purpose with one of the three <u>HRL Learning Goals</u>: <u>Authorship</u>, <u>Interculturalism</u>, <u>or Community Living</u>.

SMART goals are Specific, Measurable, Attainable, Realistic, and Timely. Your group will be required to complete the SMART goal in the Fall and Spring. Groups will present their goal and their work towards their goal in their district Community Building Meeting or community connected event.

- HRL Learning Goals: Identify which of the HRL Learning Goals you have chosen.

- Commitment to Community: Identify which of the C2C Principles or Habits you have chosen.
- Describe how your goal connects with the Commitment to Community and your group your purpose: Describe why you chose the C2C Principle or Habit and how it relates to your group's intent and purpose in 3 sentences or less.
- Achieve:
 - Describe what you are hoping your group and others in your community will learn from your work on this goal.
 - Describe how you will know you have met your goal.
 - What might you need to do differently to accomplish your goal in the spring?
